I taught advanced undergraduate economics class ECON 4500: Money and Credit at Georgia State University in spring semester of 2021. The class was designed 100% online due to covid-19 pandemic. But the whole experience was enjoyable and valuable. For an online synchronous class, I planned the whole course ahead and followed the syllabus closely. My students find the schedule was helpful and they enjoyed the structure of the class.

What I liked the most of my class is the midterm exams, which are one-page writing discussions. I have more communication with the students through these assignments in order to compensate the lack of face-to-face communication. My students also find the discussions "fun to write" and great chance to understand economic ideas. I also tried to incorporate different learning materials, such as videos, podcast, and real event discussions, especially because money and banking theories connect closely to daily life.
